



Cleaning Procedures

At the Greensboro Children's Museum, we are committed to providing a safe, clean environment for our guests. We understand how important sanitation throughout the Museum is to the health and wellbeing of children and families. Staff is trained on the following procedures to ensure we prevent the spread of germs while you play, learn, and explore.

- Deep cleaning by a professional cleaning service takes place every evening, seven days a week. The floors are mopped and vacuumed, restrooms are cleaned, and all surfaces are sanitized.
- Museum staff and volunteers disinfect all hands-on items and props regularly. We use a Peroxide-based multi-surface cleaner and disinfectant product commonly used in Children's Museums.
- To eliminate the spread of germs, Museum staff and volunteers wipe common surfaces such as handrails, doors, doorknobs, and light switches throughout the day.
- Signs are displayed in each Museum restroom to remind visitors to wash their hands; Staff are required to consistently wash their hands.
- Hand sanitizer stations are located throughout the Museum floor and at each restroom.
- Visitors are provided with "Mouthed Toy Bins" for items that have been placed in mouths.
- Tot Spot, an exhibit designed for ages 0-2, closes daily from 12:30p to 1p for cleaning. All toys are removed for sanitization and replaced with a clean set, and all surfaces are wiped with disinfectant.
- Our Water Wonders exhibit is filtered and continuously cleaned through a UV sterilizer. Chlorine, alkaline, and PH levels are checked daily.
- Costumes are cleaned every other day. They are laundered using hot water and steam drying. Between washings, all costumes are sprayed nightly with disinfecting solution.
- We have multiple sets of all exhibit props and costumes. All are cleaned and switched out daily.
- Staff are required to consistently wash their hands.
- Our visitors are welcome and encouraged to notify Museum staff if an area or object needs attention.
