Each year, the Greensboro Children's Museum welcomes thousands of visitors from the Triad and beyond to learn, play, and explore together. Located in the cultural district of downtown Greensboro, children, caregivers, and teachers of all backgrounds and abilities explore the Museum's 20+ hands-on indoor and outdoor exhibits 7 days a week, including The Edible Schoolyard, a half-acre urban teaching garden, and the Outdoor Play Plaza, which features the popular 30-foot-tall XXL Neptune Climbers. For more than 20 years, GCM staff has been committed to providing safe, hands-on learning experiences for kids, teens, and adults.

The Early Learning Educator will join an enthusiastic, forward-thinking nonprofit organization with a heart for the youngest members of our community. This position will lead and coordinate programming geared specifically for families with infants, toddlers, and preschoolers.

Roles and Responsibilities

Classes, Programs, and Events

- Develop and deliver field trip curriculum to maintain relevance to best practices and PreK – 3rd grade curriculum standards
- Develop and lead family-centric programming for ages 0-5
- Develop and lead drop-off programming for ages 4-5
- Co-lead summer camp programming for all ages
- Develop safe, play-based learning activities for our youngest visitors during special events
- Coordinate family-centric events at the Museum

Training and Mentorship

- Mentor and train assistant teachers, interns, and volunteers to be involved with programming and activities

Visitor Experience

- Greet visitors and answer questions
- Maintain a working knowledge of the Museum's mission, work, and facility to assist visitors on-site
- Facilitate opportunities for informal learning for visitors in our exhibits through guided play experiences
- Consult on Museum exhibit installations and learning elements when needed
- Build relationships with families and foster a positive and healthy environment for their children

Other Duties

Aside from the aforementioned roles and responsibilities, all GCM staff members are asked to provide assistance when needed to support the GCM team in furthering its mission of promoting learning through play. This may include but is



not limited to: performing indoor and outdoor tasks to support programming, providing back-up on other GCM programming, and relationship building with guests.

Minimum Qualifications

- Degree in Early Education, Special Education, Human Development, Psychology, Social Work, Counseling or related field plus 3-5 years' experience in a related setting
- Experience working with groups of children ages 0-5yrs and families
- A joyful attitude, flexible nature, and strong work ethic
- Working knowledge of effective and evidence-based early childhood instruction strategies
- Ability to work independently and communicate and collaborative in a team setting
- Ability to communicate with all children and their caregivers from a place of understanding and respect
- Experience with lesson planning

- Bilingual (Spanish preferred)
- Social Emotional Learning Training/Certification
- Special Needs/Inclusion Training/Certification
- Diversity and Multiculturalism Training/Certification
- Children's Yoga/Dance and Movement Therapy Training/Certification

Physical Requirements and Working Conditions

- Ability to work in a public facility
- Ability to work independently and make decisions
- Ability to stand, stoop, reach and bend; mobility of arms to reach, dexterity of hands to grasp and manipulate large and small objects
- Ability to read small print
- Ability to stand for long periods
- Ability to lift, push and/or pull objects up to 25 lbs
- Ability to work with and in proximity of equipment with moving mechanical parts
